Fort Worth Open Space Conservation Program



Our mission is to conserve high-quality natural areas as the city grows to provide environmental benefits and recreational opportunities that support economic development and enhance the livability and desirability of Fort Worth.

Goal is to preserve 10,000 acres of greenspace across Fort Worth in the next five years while growing and enhancing the City's park system. The priority goal areas are ecosystem preservation, community health, recreation, flood control, equitable access to natural spaces, economic development, and stream, River, and Lake Health. Take this survey to help protect our streams and rivers

Your responses to a short, eight-question survey can help Fort Worth protect the areas around streams, rivers and lake shores.

What are riparian areas? Riparian areas are ecosystems that occur along streams, rivers and lake shores where vegetation is strongly influenced by the presence of water.

Why is it important? Fort Worth is the fastest-growing large city in the country. It encompasses 348.24 square miles, not including its extraterritorial jurisdiction, and has 63,986 acres of undeveloped land. The ongoing growth has brought rapid development, which can create challenges for Fort Worth's watersheds.

What's being done? The City is exploring options for potential policy changes aimed at better protecting areas around streams and rivers. The effort supports Fort Worth Mayor Mattie Parker's Good Natured Greenspace Initiative and its goals to add 10,000 acres of open greenspace in Fort Worth in the next five years and grow and enhance the City's park system.

Earlier closing time approved for City parks

The Park & Recreation Department will implement earlier closing times for City parks effective Jan. 1, 2025. For more information.



Need to know: City Council on Tuesday approved changes to Chapter 24 of the City Code, revising the hours during which all parks are open to the public to 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. Currently, 117 parks have the 5 a.m. to 10 p.m., or dusk to dawn, hours, which are established under exception within the current ordinance. Other parks currently close at 11:30 p.m. The approved

ordinance retains the exception alternative.



New: Pay Municipal Court citations with convenient VanillaDirect Pay

Fort Worth Municipal Court has launched VanillaDirect Pay, a simple way to skip the courthouse and pay a citation with cash at local retailers.

Key benefits

- Convenience: Payments can be made at retail stores throughout the community.
- Cash payments: No credit or debit card is needed just a barcode and cash.
- Extended hours: Residents can make payments during store operating hours, offering more flexibility than courthouse hours.

Stop Six Choice Neighborhood Initiative Phase 3, Babers Manor



Babers Manor will be an 80-unit, mixed-income family community paying tribute to community leader Clarence Donald Babers. The development, situated between South Hughes Avenue and South Edgewood Terrace in Council District 5, will include 51 low-income units and 29 market-rate units.

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs awarded housing tax credits to help finance project development.

"We're so excited and proud to welcome our beloved community to Babers Manor with all services and amenities needed to succeed in a modern housing environment," said Fort Worth Mayor Pro Tem Gyna Bivens, who represents the Stop Six neighborhood. "The nation recognized Mr. Babers for leading the public housing rebuild in New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina as directed by President George W. Bush. Mr. Babers worked tirelessly to ensure that those that were displaced were provided modern and safe housing. We are honored to recognize Mr. Babers in the city he called home."




Watch Meetings Online Live OR Previously Recorded

The City of Fort Worth will provide free parking vouchers for residents attending any daytime City Council meeting.

How it works: Receive a voucher at the desk located just outside the City Council chambers on the second floor of City Hall, 200 Texas St. Vouchers will be available 30 minutes prior to the start of meetings until the end of the meeting.

Council goers will need to pull a parking ticket from the dispensing machine when entering the Houston Street Garage (1200 Houston

Street) and bring that ticket to the City Manager's Office. They will then be handed a voucher that can be used to charge.

Where to park: Parking is available at the Houston Street Garage, 1200 Houston St. (across from the Fort Worth Convention Center). The free parking voucher is only available for that parking garage.

For evening Council meetings, parking at downtown meters is free after 6 p.m.



For Fort Worth specific emergency alerts, download the free Code Red app!

With a basic registration, you can sign up for alerts regarding the City's Outdoor Warning System, imminent storm warnings, evacuations, and shelter in place orders.

The MyFW App is now in Spanish!

Have you heard the most recent update? The My Fort Worth (MyFW) App team is thrilled to announce a significant update for its MyFW App and website: both platforms are now available in Spanish! This enhancement is designed to better serve the City's diverse population, ensuring that Spanish-speaking residents can easily access vital City services.

For mobile users: switching the MyFW App to Spanish users need to go into their device settings, select the General for iPhone users and General Management for Android users, and choose Spanish as their preferred language. This user-friendly feature allows Spanish-speaking residents to navigate the app seamlessly, accessing important services!

On the website: the process is simple. Visitors can change the language by clicking on the globe icon located in the top right corner of the MyFW Online Request homepage. This instantly translates the site, providing Spanish-speaking users with easy access to information about city services, events, and more.



What's the 3-1-1 with Fort Worth's new 311 nonemergency service?

Residents are now able to call either 311 or the 10-digit number (817-392-1234) to reach City services. 311, a nonemergency line, can only be dialed from a wireless device and must called from within Fort Worth city limits. There is no cost for 311 mobile services.


